Who we are looking for

We are looking for results-oriented, committed prospective teachers from diverse backgrounds who want to make a difference in the world.

Qualify with a bachelor's degree and strong academic grounding in English, math, social studies or science – plus the drive to change lives. You are not required to have prior teaching experience. Currently certified teachers are not eligible for this program.

The one-year master's program includes:

- Affordable tuition
- Full-time paid teaching residency
- NYU Steinhardt faculty and curriculum
- Technology-enhanced learning and digital connectivity
- Mentorship guidance and cohort learning
- Scholarship support for eligible students
- Two-Year Employment Commitment Upon Graduation



In the NYU Steinhardt EMAT program, you'll begin teaching in one of our middle or high schools while you learn to teach. Faculty and experienced teachers provide rich mentoring and practical feedback as you gradually gain independence in the classroom.

In one year, successful candidates will have earned their Master of Arts in Teaching in secondary education from NYU Steinhardt and a guaranteed teaching position within our district, subject to availability. You also will have gained the practical skills, knowledge and experience you need to make a real difference for students as a first-year teacher.

Program coursework starts in July.

On-site residency in an Albany classroom begins in August.
